Who can play?

The Perspectivity Challenges can be played with a wide range of participant groups. In recent years Challenges have been organized all over the world for large companies like Shell, Nespresso and PriceWaterhouseCoopers, for NGO's such as Greenpeace, universities including the University of Amsterdam, the London School of Economics and the London School of Hygiene and Tropical Medicine, for the World Bank, the Asia-Pacific Programme for Security Officers, the Arab Bank, the Dutch Tax Authorities... and many more.

The Perspectivity Challenges are also suitable for use within seminars and conferences on themes like environmental and social sustainability, security, health and (cross-border) cooperation, and within schools.

Challenge Developers The Climate Challenge was developed by Perspectivity. Other challenges were collaborations between Perspectivity and The Human Security Collective (Human Security Challenge), the National Security Coordination Secretariat of Singapore (National Security Challenge) Royal Dutch Shell (Stress Nexus Challenge), Rachael Meikle and Dalya Marks (Health Challenge).

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The Climate Challenge Players face the crucial trade-off between long term sustainability and short term economic growth. Can you deal with the complex problem of climate change?



The Food Challenge The food challenge deals with the question of how we can sustainably feed a growing world population. Should you invest in intensive or organic farms? Play local or global? Can we prevent ourselves from disasters?



Decision Making Challenge Participants are responsible to optimise the performance of their unit in an organisation. Will you manage to get tasks accomplished, deal with tension, to handle conflicts, to spend your budget wisely and satisfy staff?



The Human Security Challenge Should we use hard security (intelligence, police, military forces) or soft security (diplomacy, negotiation, dialogue) in order to build a secure society? This challenge faces you with the question on how to build meaningful and trustful engagement and partnership with civil society on security matters. The thematic changes were developed together with the Human Security Collective.



The National Security Challenge

This challenge was developed in cooperation with the National Security Coordination Secretariat of Singapore. Can we move from a whole-of-government approach to national resilience to a whole-of-nation approach to national resilience? Different sectors of economy, including government, face conflict of interest, compete for resources and search for their own role in building a resilient society.



The Public Health Challenge In the Public Health Challenge players experience the dilemmas of how to pay for healthcare investments, medicines and research. Is it better to invest local or global? And which health products offer the best return on investment?

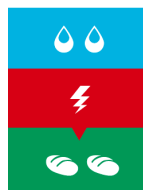

The Stress Nexus Challenge The interconnected challenges at the nexus of energy, water and food will strongly shape the future. These interconnections will cause new and sustained turbulences, which require innovative approaches to make our societies more resilient. This complexity is at the heart of the "Nexus!" challenge. You may play a company, seeking a secure market for your production. You may play a country desperately short of water. You will face land shortages, real or imagined. Innovation, boycotts, partnerships, price fluctuations, free trade, bad harvests, turbulence: it's all in the game.



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The Basics

Participants: The ideal number is 24 or higher multiples of 12, but different numbers are possible

Duration: +/- 2,5 hours

Languages: English, Dutch, Chinese, French, Russian, Arabic... Depending on the challenge, ask for the possibilities

- Six pioneering countries developing the globe
- Play at being a world leader
- Increase your revenue or influence
- Other leaders may have similar plans
- How can you best maximise your revenues?
- Each Challenge is followed by a powerful debriefing and group discussion
